Grant variation from The Careers & Enterprise Company in respect of the Enterprise Adviser Network (EAN) and the addition of a Wave Two Careers Hub

In August 2018 we issued a grant letter covering the provision of the Enterprise Adviser Network through to August 2020. You will be aware that subsequently your bid for a Wave Two Careers Hub for the 2019-20 academic year has been successful.

This letter is to confirm a variation to the original grant letter encompassing the provision of the Wave Two Careers Hub. The Terms and Conditions for this grant are not being changed, though you will now need to pay reference to the clauses relating to Careers Hubs if you have not had a Wave One Careers Hub. A copy of the Terms and Conditions are included for your reference.

The variation comes in two main sections, the resourcing for the Careers Hub and remaining Enterprise Adviser Network and the targets that Careers Hubs are being asked to achieve.

Resourcing allocation September 2019 to August 2020.

- For your area full coverage (based on the figures that we hold) will amount to 56
 mainstream schools and colleges. This is the proxy used to allocated Enterprise Coordinator
 resource. From September there will be:
 - 40 schools and colleges within your Careers Hub, of which
 - o 35 are mainstream schools and colleges
 - This leaves 21 mainstream schools and colleges in the core network.

The maximum number of full time equivalent staff we estimate you would need at full capacity is therefore:

^{*}Where you have engaged multiples of four Enterprise Coordinators, we recommend that one of the four posts be graded to a Senior Enterprise Coordinator, but this is a local decision. We will fund up to an additional £5,000 per annum on a 50:50 cash match basis for a Senior Enterprise Coordinator post.

Opportunity Area Enterprise Coordinators are fully funded at a rate of up to £50,000 per FTE.

2. Targets for 2019-2020

Existing targets are not affected by the creation of the Wave Two Careers Hub.

For the schools and colleges in the Wave Two Careers Hub the following additional targets are set:
