Hamworthy Bridge

The £660,000 Growing Places Fund has enabled the Borough of Poole to deliver the Hamworthy Rail Crossing which now provides safe and easy access for residents walking or cycling via the Harbour Reach development to reach the facilities in Hamworthy Park. The bridge forms a vital part of a connected corridor from Hamworthy Park to the new development sites in the Hamworthy regeneration area, while also linking the forthcoming Townside Access and Town Centre North schemes.

At the formal opening of the bridge, then Mayor of Poole, Cllr Ann Stribley said: "This is a momentous day. We have all waited a long time for this crossing to be built. It is an important link between Poole Town and Hamworthy and I'm sure it will prove very popular with residents."
