Commercial

The Ports of Dorset offer boat building, fit out and servicing. Whether it's building luxury yachts at Sunseeker International, specialist life boat construction of the Shannon Class at the RNLI or bespoke workboats for use across the globe at Manor Marine, Dorset is definitely in a class of its own. Dorset also offers great expertise in underwater marine engineering serviced by specialist diving companies.

Energy

Companies and organisations such as Norco GRP, Drilling Systems, IHC Sea Steel and Netzsch Pumps provide specialist skills in marine related platforms and product services for the oil and gas and offshore renewable industries – Poole Harbour, home to Wytch Farm, owned by Perenco, is the largest on shore oil field in Western Europe.

Leisure

Dorset is a great place for leisure, whether it's wreck diving in Weymouth Bay, sea fishing off Portland, windsurfing in Poole Harbour or sailing alongside the Jurassic Coast. Dorset has some great marinas and is home to innovative leisure marine companies such as 03 Wetsuits, Animal and The National Sailing Academy – venue of all the 2012 Olympic and Paralympic sailing events.



Naval Defence

Military coastal use in Dorset has a long history, most recently the naval base in Portland. Portland Port continues to be the port of choice for the Royal Fleet Auxiliary. Military changes have allowed Dorset's waters to become the ideal location for developing and testing underwater defence equipment. It is therefore the natural choice for companies such as Atlas Elektronik UK, BAE Systems, Coda Octopus, Qinetiq, Sonadyne and SALT to develop and test the latest underwater technologies. Poole is home to the Royal Marines and several global marine security companies including Solace.

Dorset Key Sites

Portland

Osprey Quay offers a spacious and prestigious waterside location with further development up to 5.59Ha for freehold sale. Just some of the companies present on Portland are Sunseeker International, Manor Marine, Global Marine Systems, Coda Octopus, IAP G3 Systems, Glencore Agriculture, InterMarine and O3 Wetsuits. Portland Port offers over 35ha near water development site with extensive waterside land available for industrial development. Dean & Reddyhoff have recently invested £25m in their Portland Marina.

Port of Poole

The Port of Poole and surrounding area is one of Dorset's key assets. £23,310,000 from Dorset LEP's Growth Deal fund is being invested into four major transport schemes to improve access into and around the Port of Poole.

The investment will help drive local economic growth and bring an anticipated £500 million of leveraged private investment in to the area. Poole is home to major marine businesses such as the HQ of Sunseeker International and major operations of the likes of Wartsila Water Systems, Norco GRP and Aish Technologies

Bournemouth Airport

The Bournemouth International Growth (BIG) Programme is a major plan focused on improving connectivity, easing congestion, protecting existing jobs and creating new ones in and around Bournemouth Airport and Wessex Fields. £45,200,000 has been secured to fund a series of transport and infrastructure investments along the A338 and B3073 corridors aimed at facilitating better access into and around Bournemouth Airport as well as unlocking employment land at Aviation Business Park and at Wessex Fields.

Dorset Innovation Park

Dorset Innovation Park Enterprise Zone is an advanced engineering cluster of excellence for the South West, building on strengths in marine, defence and energy. A single site accommodating 50 hectares of land, of which 35 hectares is developable, it is the second largest strategic employment site in Dorset.

Port of Poole

- The Port of Poole is a trust port, operated by Poole Harbour Commissioners, it benefits from a central position on the south coast and, with established land and sea communications, is the largest exporting port of live shellfish in the UK to markets in France, Spain and Portugal.
- The Port has the potential to accommodate marine-related business operations on-site (including boat building and engineering) that require access to deep-water frontage. Sunseeker operates part of its motor yacht manufacturing business on the site.
- Port of Poole provides services including conventional and containerised (TEU & FEU) freight handling, cross-channel ferry services, cargo forwarding and storage.
- The South Quay will enable the port to receive 40-50 cruise ships a year.

Portland Port

- Ideal location adjacent to the main English Channel shipping lanes
- Able to accommodate vessels in excess of 340m LOA
- Depths alongside up to 11.6m C.D.
- Over 35Ha of development land available

Poole Maritime Festival

Poole Maritime Festival is an annual summer event, taking place at a variety of locations in Poole. It builds on the success of European Maritime Day.
